

Membership & Fees

An annual PRSC social membership fee of \$79 is required to participate in Sailability activities at PRSC. In addition, there is a sailing fee of \$25 each week which contributes to the maintenance and replacement costs of our boats and equipment. These fees can be paid by EFPTOS or cash each week. (If financial hardship makes these fees unaffordable please discuss confidentially with the Sailability Coordinator.)

How to prepare for sailing...

Everyone should be prepared with suitable clothing:

- Sunglasses & a well-fitting hat that won't blow off (we suggest a tie cord)
- Water proof jacket & a jumper
- Footwear with soft rubber soles
- A bottle of water and a healthy snack.
- Apply sunscreen before you leave home

Safety and responsibility ...

All Sailability participants must adhere to Sailability & PRSC rules and policies including...

Life-Jackets: All participants MUST wear a correctly fitted lifejacket at all times on the pontoon, jetty and onboard any boat.
